- Password Free Wi-Fi from our outdoor benches and parking lot!

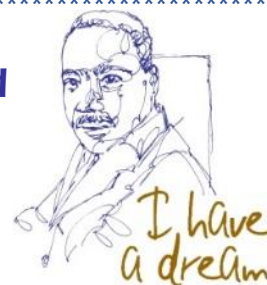

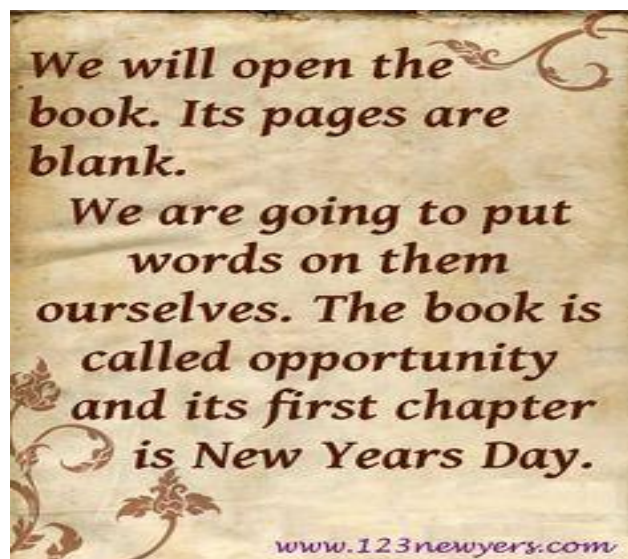

South Jefferson Library will be closed Monday, January 18th in observance of Martin Luther King, Jr. Day







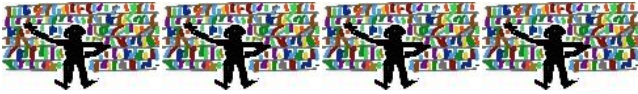

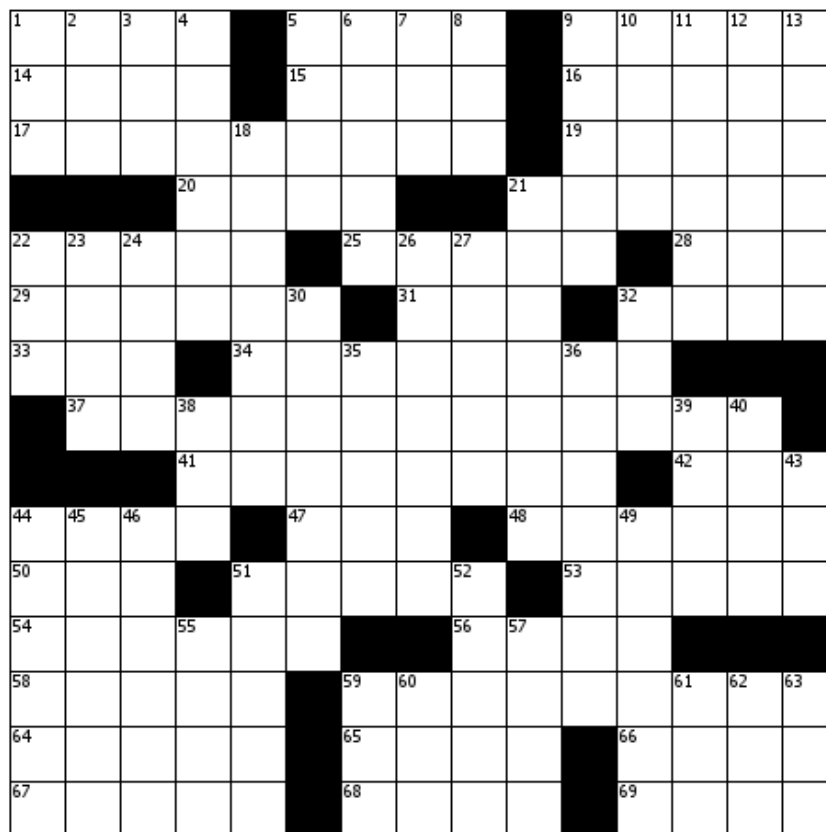
